1 As a passenger of Marine Atlantic sending dangerous goods on one of our vessels, you are considered the consignor or shipper.

Enter your name, address, and phone number at the top of the form.

2 The UN number is the first item to be included on the form, it's a four-digit number that's used internationally to identify dangerous goods. [Learn More](#).

3 The proper shipping name accurately identifies the dangerous good being transported. [Learn More](#).

4 Dangerous goods fall under one of nine primary classes. [Learn More](#).

5 Many dangerous goods also have a subsidiary class or compatibility group. Compatibility Group applies to Class 1 - Explosives, and is indicated by a letter.

6 Some items have a packing group, which indicates the degree of danger of a product or substance.

7 Flash point is a temperature related to the vapours of a liquid igniting. [Learn More](#).

8 Dangerous Goods are a Marine Pollutant if the special provision column contains "P".

9 The quantity of dangerous goods uses metric measurements. For example, use kilograms and litres.

10 Gross/net mass includes both the weight of the dangerous goods and the container, or means of containment.

11 Once you have completed your dangerous goods form, write out your name then sign and include today's date. It's also important to include a phone number where you can be reached any time.
